Rabbi's Message:

The following behavior only takes a few minutes each day. You will feel better, little by little, be a little calmer, even if you are in physical pain and/or psychic pain. You will be more

grounded, emotionally balanced, self-aware, sympathetic, empathetic, spiritual, and grateful. You will be a better co-worker and friend, a better spouse, a better person, a better Jew. My God, what is this daily behavior?

It is prayer. Every night before we go to sleep, we pray out loud. For what? We praise the Master of the Universe for the majestic creation of our world and universe. We thank God for our blessings, even in the midst of our aggravations. We petition God for the release of the hostages in Gaza and for their health. We ask for the security and success of the IDF, US military, and others battling evil. We ask for the healing of others (and ourselves). Then we sing the Shema (Deuteronomy 6:5) and May The Words (Psalm 19:15). — And in the morning, our prayers take about 1 minute. We sing Modeh Ani (thank the good Lord we have another day) and the Shema.

Mute your TV, pause your YouTube, put down your phone, close your laptop. Take a couple of minutes to pray and develop a little bit more inner peace, courage, and strength.

PASSOVER. Pesach brings longer days and more sunshine — thank God!

Cultivate an attitude of gratitude. Put in the reverse, Judaism teaches us, never to practice ingratitude. This is especially apt as we approach our joyous spring festival of Passover. Pesach begins Monday evening, April 22. Our congregational Seder is Tuesday evening, April 23. As with our usual worship services, the Seder will be on our Live Stream feed via our website tintcleveland.org and YouTube. Join us in person or follow along at home. Food costs continue to rise, so please be a Seder Sponsor, whether you plan to attend or not.

Considering Jewish history, if ancient Israel was entitled to despise* a nation, it was Egypt, right? Over centuries, the Egyptians had enslaved our ancestors, and the Pharaoh had attempted to murder all newborn baby boys (Exodus 1:22). Yet later, after the Egyptians had been punished with the Ten Plagues and the Israelite slaves had been freed, the Torah taught: "You shall not abhor an Egyptian, for you were a stranger in their land." (Deuteronomy 23:8)

Why would the Torah teach us NOT to hate the Egyptians? Rabbi Joseph Hertz, the late Chief Rabbi of the British Empire commented (Hertz Chumash page 847), the Israelites were commanded to remember that originally, hundreds of years earlier — during a severe famine in Canaan — they were

Erika Taubner Gold was born in 1932 in Budapest, Hungary. In December 1944, she and her mother were put on Nazi trucks, but escaped and hid with a former housekeeper until liberation. They reunited with her father and immigrated to Cuba in 1948 and to Cleveland 1950. She learned English and graduated from Cleveland Heights High School and Western Reserve University. Erika worked as a medical technologist at Doctors' Hospital, Suburban Hospital, and a private lab at Southgate. She married and raised two children, who in turn have given her four grandchildren and two great grandchildren. Erika was honored as a Cleveland Jewish News Difference Maker in 2015 and Cleveland Heights High School Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame in 2019. She also received both the President's Award at Temple Israel Ner Tamid and named Hero in the City of Beachwood in 2023. She serves on the Board of Temple Israel Ner Tamid as well. She volunteers with Jewish Family Service Association and Maltz Museum of Jewish Heritage. Erika helps plan and execute Cleveland's Yom HaShoah commemoration each year, often speaking to groups in Northeast Ohio about the Holocaust. She is a member and speaker for the Kol Israel Foundation. She is VP of the NEO chapter of World Federation of Jewish Survivors of the Holocaust and Descendants. Erika is an active member of NA'AMAT and National Council of Jewish Women (NCJW).

allowed to enter Egypt as guests. Although later the Egyptians enslaved our ancestors, the initial act of kindness should never be forgotten.

And what about in our daily lives? If you have profited, in any way, from another person with whom your relationship later soured, you must not allow yourself to forget that earlier good the person did for you. This is very difficult for some of us, however, it has the power to free us from some of the angry memories which enslave us.

In the words of Rabbi Joseph Telushkin, "The prohibition against ingratitude applies not just to personal kindnesses and favors, but also to intellectual influences." Thus, be grateful to any person from whom you have learned. If you learned the basics from a person and now you have more knowledge than she, do not forget that without her initial teachings you may not be where you are!

In the coming days, make some moments to express your gratitude to another person. Banish the words of ingratitude which you might otherwise speak. Your relationships with others will be better. It will be fitting preparation for Pesach, our spring festival when life and hope spring eternal.


