Rabbi's Message:

Consider the Talmud — college campuses — Golda Meir — and Sundays, May 5 and May 12. The Jewish people is talmudic, thank God. What does that mean? It means — all Torah commentaries, Midrashim (legends), Jewish stories and Jewish law are just like the Talmud — issues are introduced, discussed, investigated, dissected, disagreed upon, agreed upon, mulled over, and prayed upon.

Even the issues YOU think are ridiculous and not worth your time, no matter how troubling or trivial, need your learning and discussion. When your loved ones, co-workers or friends, do not want to pose questions and seek answers — find someone with whom to discuss weighty issues. You are likely to find such a person at our congregation.

And in those discussions, follow the spirit of Pirke Avot 2:5. Rabbi Hillel “would also say: A boor cannot be sin-fearing, an ignoramus cannot be pious, a bashful one cannot learn, a short-tempered person cannot teach, nor does anyone who does much business grow wise....”

A boor is defined as someone who is rude and insensitive. When discussing issues, and people raise their voices, lower yours and engage in a discussion, not a shouting match. This is not easy, and by the way, although YOU think the others are wrong about an issue — YOU may be the wrong one. At least, be open to learning from others and considering nuances. 100% agreement is not the goal, learning and growing is the goal. This is better for you, the congregation, the Jewish people, and the people of our beloved America.

Tsuris on campus. Every day, we see troubling manifestations of anti-semitism and anti-Israel sentiments on some college campuses. At Columbia, protesters are demanding the university divest from companies who do business with Israel and sever academic ties with professors in Israel. At the time of writing, USC has canceled its public graduation ceremony because of protestors. This is a shonda — a shame. What about the years of learning and hard work the graduating students put in? What about the tuition costs they paid to USC? Shouldn't their rights be considered over the protestors?

As a Jew — or non-Jew — who loves the Jewish people and the state of Israel, do not apologize for being pro-Israel, a Zionist, a lover of the Jewish people, and the state of Israel. Unfortunately, Hamas teaches their children to hate Jews, western civilization, Israel and America. We have,

and we will, continue to teach our children to be courageous, fight evil, seek to banish evil and pursue peace. We can be staunch defenders of Israel AND pursuers of peace. We can do both.

Golda Meir, of blessed memory (1898-1978), gave wise and poignant counsel when, in London in 1969, she said: "We can forgive the Arabs for killing our children. We cannot forgive them for forcing us to kill their children. We will only have peace with the Arabs when they love their children more than they hate us."

Most of our brothers and sisters in Israel seem to agree with Golde's sentiments. They want peace AND they want Israel to exist in security. They do not want to live in peace if it means sacrificing the existence of the state of Israel. From the shores of the USA, we support Israel.

At Temple Israel Ner Tamid, we do not apologize for being pro-Israel, Zionist, lovers of the Jewish people, the state of Israel and America. We are lovers of peace and we pursue it. We engage in acts of loving kindness and acts of tzedakah. It is a mitzvah to do both. We help others and look forward to receiving the help of others.

Sunday, May 5 at 4:30 p.m., at B'nai Jeshurun, we will commemorate — Yom HaShoah, the Holocaust and the Heroism of our ancestors. As usual, I will bring our Precious Legacy Torah Scroll to process in at the beginning of the ceremony. This year, Erika Gold will solemnly walk with me. Erika and I invite all of our religious school students to join us in the solemn procession. We ask students to wear dark pants or skirts, and white tops or shirts. Meet us in the B'nai Jeshurun lobby at 4:10 p.m. Todah Rabbah.

Sunday, May 12, be among Religious School students, families, and everyone who supports the Jewish people and Israel. At TINT, we will gather in support of Israel for our annual Yom Ha-Atzmaut Parade. (In Israel, her 76th year of independence will be observed on Tuesday, May 14.) We will walk through our Mayfield Heights neighborhood. The route is one mile long and takes less than an hour. "Step off" is at 9:30 a.m.

Gather with us in the Sanctuary at 9:00 a.m. for announcements, a minute of silence with a Yom Ha-Zikaron (Memorial Day) siren, and Kaddish for those who have given "the last full measure of devotion" in defense of Israel. In the parade, we will walk, sing, pick-up litter, and wave American and Israeli flags. As usual, we will have a couple of MHPD cruisers to slowly lead and follow the marchers.

Four more things: (1) You may join us in the parade with your leashed dog. If your dog is a barker, please do not bring him/her.

(2) Do not bring your dog into the Sanctuary for Yom Ha-Zikaron. No matter how well-behaved you think your dog is. We will repeat the Kaddish outside before we "step off" in the parade.

(3) There will be some nosh afterwards, and I am looking for several more sponsors. Call the TINT office to help out.

(4) If you have a convertible, or a pick-up truck, join us in the parade. Flags look great in the breeze. And you will be able to give some of our more elderly celebrants a lift.

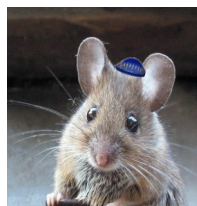
