

Rabbi's Message:

We just concluded 8 nights of Chanukah during which we shed light for 8 nights. May it be God's will for us to shed light each and every day. Each night we lit the Chanukiah and sang Maoz

Tsur "Rock of Ages." God is our eternal rock, eternal foundation, and eternal light.

God's Torah is filled with eternal lessons. The teachings are applicable in our generation, in the previous generation, in the next generation, and in ALL generations. The teachings are accessible to you and me.

Take to heart and soul this spark of eternal wisdom from the 19th century. According to the Chafetz Chaim, the story of Joseph the Dreamer, and his brothers, is really the historic saga of the Jewish people. We meet Joseph in Genesis 37:2, "these are the generations of Jacob. Joseph, being 17 years old was feeding the flock with his brethren, and...."

Joseph, was the most beloved child of Jacob and Rachel. They favored him over the rest of their children. Jacob gave Joseph a coat of many colors. Because of his brothers' jealousy and enmity, Joseph was shackled and forced to leave his home and birthplace. Joseph was thrown into a pit, nearly killed, sold into slavery, taken to Egypt, and handed over to immoral and unethical people, who sought to "do him in" at every turn.

In spite of it all, Divine Providence turned everything around. The seeming tragedy of being torn from his home in Canaan and sold as a slave was, ultimately, the cause of Joseph's rise to power. After his Egyptian master threw him into a dungeon, Joseph met Pharaoh's imprisoned butler who became the catalyst for his meteoric rise to power, as a savior over Egypt and a savior for his family and the entire region. (Review Genesis chapters 40-41)

God's Hand works in mysterious ways which we cannot fathom. Mankind often finds itself in terrible trouble, never dreaming the seemingly hopeless situation is, in actuality, the springboard for salvation.

The story of Joseph is the story of our people, collectively and individually. Collectively — throughout our long history, whenever our ancestors seemed to hit "rock bottom," it was really God's way of preparing them for redemption and return to the Promised Land of Israel. In the present day, when the Jewish people experience hatred, death, and tragedy, it should serve to remind us God will help bring us victory and redemption. And individually — when you and I hit "rock bottom," it is most helpful to view it as God's way of preparing us, strengthening us, and helping us to arrive at a time of redemption and salvation.

Each Chanukah night we lit the Chanukiah and sang Maoz Tsur "Rock of Ages." Originally composed in 13th century, it recounts the wonders of the
